#### PRINCIPAL'S ADDRESS

The 2017 year is rapidly drawing to an end. It has been a Year full of challenges and opportunities for our staff, students and parents. The school has been busy starting the Year 12 courses early for our Year 11 students, preparing for our new Year 7's coming in 2018 and organising our reward excursions for the end of the Term.

The school will again grow significantly in 2018 with our school population increasing to above 1050 students. We will also have a number of new staff



members who have been specifically chosen by the school through a number of selection panels. The increase in student numbers is a bonus for all students across the school as it will enable MRSHS to offer an increase in subject offerings. This will be particularly pertinent in the future with upper school offerings.

We just completed the Year 6 to 7 Orientation Days for students coming to Margaret River Senior High School in 2018. These were exciting days for the school as our future students get to experience High School life and we were very pleased to see so many parents attend. I would like to thank staff involved in preparing and presenting over the two days of our orientation and thank all the parents who attended information sessions.

#### Attendance

From the beginning of 2018 the school we will continue our clear focus on improving attendance rates at MRSHS. The number of students with regular

attendance (90% attendance and above) in 2017 for Margaret River Senior High School was 71%. This is a significant improvement from 2016(61%) and ensures that these students have the best possible chance of achieving their potential. All vacations at Margaret River senior High School, that take place during the school term will be processed through the school as unauthorised absences. Whilst I understand that work commitments and schedules affect when families can take holidays, students missing school during these times is having a significant impact on their progress. I encourage parents to think carefully when planning holidays and take into account the impact on their children's education. Work will not be provided for students who are taking holidays and assessments that are missed may not be able to be rescheduled, thus effecting student's overall grades. This is particularly pertinent for students who have cumulative assessments in Year 11 and 12. Work will be provided for students who are on Australian or State representation, long term illness or exceptional circumstances that are approved by the Principal.

Student attendance rates will be a key factor in the School's Good Standing Policy, which will determine which students attend events such as end of year reward excursions.

I look forward to parent's cooperation on this matter.

#### Uniform

#### **Ben Hopkins - National Junior Volleyball Championships**

Ben Hopkins has just returned from competing in the National Junior Volleyball Championships on the Gold Coast.

Ben represented Western Australia in the Under 17's Men's team and played Queensland, Victoria, New South Wales, South Australia and the ACT. The competition ran over 9 days and the WA team was very competitive. Western Australia was the only team to take a set off Queensland in the last two years.

Ben was successful in being selected for the 20 man squad after a two phase trial conducted in Perth. The squad then trained twice a week for 5 weeks in the last half of term 2, including a fitness test and physiotherapist screening whilst at Country Week.

After his successful selection in the final team of 10, Ben travelled to Perth twice a week after school to train for all of term 3. His commitment to the team and training was commended by the coaching staff at the presentation ceremony, as he was the only regional person to represent WA in any age group. Western Australia ended up placing 5<sup>th</sup> overall in a very close competition.

GARLIC

We harvested our garlic and students enjoyed learning how to plait it. I'm not sure what we will do with all this garlic but for now it will be hung for the school holidays to dry out and we will decide when school returns next year. The planting on Anzac Day and harvesting on Remembrance Day worked a treat. We fertilised it with a dilution of sulphate of potash every week 10 weeks before harvest to get a huge crop of healthy, fat garlic bulbs.

The students displayed very good skills and safety awareness ensuring a rewarding experience for all, both students and instructors.



The Year 10 HASS Geography were required to choose and research a local development focusing on the environmental impact and the environmental management plans the developers implemented.


The students' findings were used to create a report and an accompanying "before" and "after" model. The developments chosen were varied and included those that have already taken place: e.g. Ten Mile Brook, Augusta Marina; those under way at the moment, e.g. Margaret River SHS, Rapids Landing Primary School, Busselton and Koombana Bay foreshores or those planned in the near future, e.g. AMR MRSHS Stage 1 Redevelopment - BEFORE Cultural Centre or the main street redevelopment.

Many students contacted those undertaking the developments, made site visits in their own time taking photos and drawings sketches and/or arranged interviews with key people from each of the developments.

As you can see from the photos of our own Margaret River SHS Stage 1 redevelopment, created by Jodi Barnett, Georgia Jennion and Zali Morgan, the quality of the research and models was of a very high standard.

This has been another very successful year for our students pursuing Vocational Pathways in 2017. Year 12's completed their Certificate courses on and off campus and many engaged in flexible programs. Year 11's successfully completed a second round of WPL, with many securing part time employment for the summer. We thank our ever expanding group of supportive employers who continue to provide our students with the opportunity to learn a little more about the world of work, and a lot more about themselves.

It has also been a busy time with nearly 40 Year 10 and 11 students signed up for VET in Schools programs at

Bunbury, Busselton and Margaret River TAFE Campuses for 2018. Entry is highly competitive with only 350 places available for the 1000 applicants across the whole South West. Furthermore an increasing number of students are taking the strategic decision to sign up for School Based Traineeships as an alternative to leaving school full time.

I would also like to thank the VET Team; we have enjoyed the company of two graduates Emma and Matt who have enthusiastically embraced the programs, being guided by our very wise Laurie Barker, and all those who have stepped in to support this year. Donna Burgess has provided constant office assistance under increasing administration requirements for both VET and WPL. We look forward to an exciting 2018.

#### **Science News**

#### FORENSICS

Science classes have been a frenzy of Forensics for the year 9 students. Students enthusiastically participated in Facial Reconstruction, by moulding plasticine onto skull models to replicate soft tissue structures to depict realistic facial features.

Pollen detectives examined various pollen samples under microscopes to determine if the "suspect" "John Doe" had been at the murder scene when forensic scientists found pollen grains on his pants. The super sleuths had to determine if John Doe was guilty by analysing which pollen grains were on his pants and if they matched the type of pollen found near the victim.

Finger print analysis and using fingerprints to determine whether a suspect was at a crime scene has always been an essential part of forensic science due to the unique nature of a print. Students used several methods of lifting prints from porous and non porous materials as a starting point of piecing together a crime.



## Water Wise News






The Water Wise Committee




Each program is designed to provide students who have an interest in science with an opportunity to engage in a wide range of fascinating science activities under the guidance of scientists who love their work.


