Login into connect with your P number and password
(remember that any '0' in the username are zeros)

To login go to:

To View Assessment outlines:

- 1 Click on the **My Children** link at the top to show your child's classes:

- 2 Click on **Assessment Outlines** to view the Assessment Outlines for your child.
This will show you the *Cumulative Percent* for each subject at that time
(subject to moderation and scaling).

The box and whisker plot gives you an idea of how your child is ranked in the class or assessment.

Your child's score is represented by the black dot.

The median score of the class is represented by the line in the middle of the box.
