We have had an excellent start to our school year with students and teachers returning after their holiday break invigorated and keen to get to work. The start to the school year has been extremely smooth, even with the building program being in progress and it is exciting to see many new enrolments which has resulted in our numbers increasing to 1090 for 2019. It was particularly pleasing to note the high level of compliance with our dress code at our first assembly; I thank students and parents for their assistance in this matter. A reminder that the school

uniform is compulsory and has been endorsed by the Margaret River Senior High School Board.

I would like to congratulate and acknowledge the outstanding achievements of our Year 12 cohort in 2018. Our ATAR students were impressive with a median ATAR (rank to get them into university) of 82.4, placing the school in the Top 50 schools in the state in this area. These results were achieved through their hard work and determination throughout their time at MRSHS. I am very proud that 124 out of 126 students achieved the National Attainment standard which is a massive effort by these students.

Our Vocation Education Training (VET) students were also extremely successful in their endeavours with over 95% of VET students achieving a Certificate II or higher in their final year.

I would like to thank the staff who worked with these students over the five years that they attended our school, assisting them to achieving these outstanding results. As well, I would like to acknowledge the terrific support we received from parents and the community in providing a wide range of opportunities these students.

#### **Attendance**

From the beginning of 2019 the school has had a clear focus on improving attendance rates at MRSHS. Whilst I understand that work commitments and schedules affect when families can take holidays, students missing school during these times is having a significant impact on their progress. I encourage parents to think carefully when planning holidays and take into account the impact on their children's education. Work will not be provided for students who are taking holidays and assessments that are missed may not be able to be rescheduled, thus effecting student's overall grades. This is particularly pertinent for students who have cumulative assessments in Year 11 and 12. Work will be provided for students who are on Australian or State representation, long term illness or exceptional circumstances that are approved by the Principal.

Student attendance rates will be a key factor in the School's Good Standing Policy, which will determine which students attend events such as end of year reward excursions.

In 2019, we again have a clear focus on providing students with relevant homework that is aimed to assist with completion of school courses and provide extension for high performing students. Parents are encouraged to assist by checking student diaries and helping set good study and homework routines at home. # **Good Standing Policy**

Good Standing aims to recognise and assist students to take responsibility for their actions and to encourage each student to improve his or her own performance.

The outcome sought for each student is to maintain focus on their educational outcomes by being responsible for their own success. It is expected that all students will maintain their Good Standing.

To track Good Standing, Student Services will look at the following:

- Attendance
- Behaviour
- Academic performance (Work Standards)
- Uniform

If a student is suspended they will automatically loose Good Standing for a period.

Should a student lose Good Standing they will be unable to represent the school or participate in excursions until Good Standing is restored.

# **OLNA Testing**

Western Australian students are required to demonstrate the minimum standard in reading, writing and numeracy to be eligible to achieve the Western Australian Certificate of Education (WACE) by the end of Year 12. This is attained by either achieving Band 8 or higher in their Year 9 NAPLAN Tests **Or** Achievement Category of 3 in the OLNA Tests (Numeracy, Reading and Writing) during Years 10, 11 or 12.

Parents of students needing to sit the OLNA test in Year 10, 11 or 12 will receive an email from the school.

# Year 7 and 8 school-based immunisation program 2019

In 2019, the school-based immunisation program is moving from year 8 to year 7. Students in both year groups will be offered the vaccines as part of this transition. From 2020 onward, the program will routinely be offered in year 7 only.

Parents/guardians must read, sign and return the immunisation consent form provided by their school AS SOON AS POS-SIBLE

The program is delivered in two visits across the school year, TERM 1 and TERM 4.

If your child misses any vaccines offered at school, visit your GP, Aboriginal Medical Service or community immunisation clinic (consultation fees may apply).

Vaccines offered: Human papillomavirus (HPV)

Diphtheria-tetanus-whooping cough (Pertussis) (dTpa)

#### **Smartphones in Schools - Special Report**

In June 2018, the NSW Minister for Education, commissioned an independent review into the non-educational use of mobile devices in NSW schools.

The review was led by Dr Michael Carr-Gregg, and supported by other independent experts as well as many students, parents and guardians, teachers and principals who were consulted in the process. As a result, the use of mobile devices during school hours will now be restricted in NSW public primary schools.


Currently, school policies around the use of electronic devices during school hours vary widely. Technology does have a role to play in the classroom, but this needs to be facilitated. Personal smartphones, on the other hand, are proving to be a distraction for students in terms of their access to social media sites, as well as potentially being a source of bullying activities.


