Drama students present "Jasper Jones"

In Week 2 next term Year 10,11 and 12 Drama students will present "Jasper Jones" (based on the novel by Craig Silvey and adapted for stage by Kate Mulvany).

This touching play highlights the brutality, racism and sexism of rural Australia in the 1960s. Set in the fictional, Western Australian town of Corrigan in 1965 the play centres on the character Charlie Bucktin who is called to help Jasper Jones (an Aboriginal boy who is desperate to clear his name and prove his innocence when a young girl dies tragically).

The play involves adult themes and coarse language and is suitable for a mature (15 plus) audience. We are lucky enough to be performing the play at the new MARGARET RIVER HEART STUDIO THEATRE. This intimate studio theatre is situated adjacent to the MR Hawks football club rooms.

The play will run for three nights from Wednesday, 8th of May until Friday, 10th of May. Tickets will go on sale in the last week of this term and are available from Arts Margaret River 9758 7316 or online at www.artsmargaretriver.com

Tyrell and his family have returned to Margaret River just this year and his commitment to our production will see him on stage for the very first time.

Acting Workshops Myles Pollard/ Vivienne Garret

All Drama students involved in "Jasper Jones" were treated to a series of intensive, highly valuable workshops run by actor/director Myles Pollard. Having played a role in the recent film production of "Jasper Jones" Myles was able to share his insights and his connection to the script. He helped students extend their acting choices through analysis into the objectives and the backstories of each character. Myles directed Tyrell McKenzie-Roe (Jasper Jones) and some selected Year 10 students to choreograph the stage fighting needed in one very touching scene.

Along with Myles, actor Vivienne Garret has also been workshopping with our actors. She has worked closely with Year 10 students who have stepped up to take on difficult roles in this play. Zhao (Jack) Zhengyang (who came to our school from China in 2017) will play Jeffery Lu in this production. Vivienne has been working with Jack and with others on vocal clarity and authenticity in their scenes.



Term 1 in Home Ec Room 2

Year 7

Year 7 students were introduced to the importance of safety and hygiene when preparing food and started developing their skills with a variety of equipment. Students used their new found skills to design and prepare their own delicious pasta salad. Other recipes prepared this term include apple crumble with custard and tuna patties.





Year 9

Year 9 students have been comparing homemade foods with a variety of processed and packaged alternatives. Discussing the concepts of food miles, buying local and food labelling have enabled students to evaluate food products to determine the ones that best meet their food needs now and into the future.





Students have prepared many different recipes including homemade chicken nuggets, potato wedges and meat pies (using a variety of different pastries).





Year 11 Students

The Year 11 Food Science and Technology Course has introduced students to the Occupational Health and Safety requirements when preparing food in a commercial situation. The knowledge and skills gained have enabled students to plan, prepare and evaluate a variety of meals. Incorporating local Margaret River foods into their meal planning has been a focus and students have been able to identify the economic and social benefits of supporting local food businesses.



The main focus of the Year 10 course is the multicultural nature of Australia's cuisine and its origins. Initially students prepared meals that are stereotypically identified as Australian before researching, planning and preparing a meal from a country that has had a significant influence on Australia's food. Students will continue to explore the cuisines of international countries in term 2.



Year 12 Students

Year 12 Food Science and Technology students have been exploring the science behind food preparation to understand why certain things happen when food is prepared and cooked. The preparation of a simple meal such as a Chicken Caesar Salad with Aioli, involves many different chemical processes and understanding why certain things happen is enabling students to develop their cooking knowledge and skills.




